Berlin's readiness to support Tunisian co-operation project in education and vocational training

He also took part in a working session at the German Foreign

Ministry where he discussed with the General Director of Cultural

Affairs and Communication means to develop Tunisian-German co-

In this connection, the German official voiced his country's

readiness to back up transition in Tunisia according to the Tunisian

people's priorities. He expressed Berlin's interest to encourage the

establishment in Tunisia of a French-German university.

Mr. Taïeb Baccouche also conferred with officials from the
